The festival of independent art spaces in Vienna

Vienna's independent art spaces are jointly hosting citywide open house days. All participating spaces will be open from 2 to 6 p.m during the first weekend in June, and have ongoing exhibitions visitors can attend without pre-registration and free of charge, while exploring the city outside of the obvious tourist attractions.

What is an Independent Space?

Independent Space Index lists any permanent physical space that publicly exhibits contemporary art in Vienna and is neither a commercial gallery nor a major institution. These spaces often operate as a *Kunstverein* (Art Association). In case of doubt, this working definition is followed:

An Independent Space is a self-organized exhibition space which primarily and programmatically exhibits contemporary art. An Independent Space is accessible to the public and engages in mediation work. An Independent Space does not strive for financial profit.
